Part 1: Conference Information Card (*Card*)

I. General Information:

1. Name of the Conference: XXX International James Joyce Symposium (hereinafter referred to as *Conference*)
2. Conference dates: 15-19 June, 2026 (*Date*)
3. Conference Venue: Collegium Novum, and buildings of Faculty of Polish Studies, ul. Gołębia, Krakow (*Place*)
4. Conference Organiser: Jagiellonian University, ul. Gołębia 24, 31-007 Kraków, on whose behalf the activities related to the Conference organisation are carried out by the Faculty of Philology, Institute of English Studies, al. Mickiewicza 9, 31-120 Krakow (hereinafter referred to as the "*Organiser*").

11. Active participants are the Participants who present a Paper (*Speakers*)
12. Rules for selecting Speakers to participate in the Conference: participation in the Conference is decided by the academic committee consisting of: Prof. Finn Fordham, Royal Holloway, University of London, Prof. Joe Brooker, Birkbeck College, University of London, dr hab. Katarzyna Bazarnik, prof. UJ, on the basis of an evaluation of submitted abstracts in accordance with the following criteria: relevance to the Conference theme and scholarly quality (including the importance of a research topic and correctness of methodology). Participants will also include Speakers who have accepted the Organiser's invitation to give plenary lectures and special presentations (*Plenary Speakers*). (*Rules for qualifying for active participation in the Conference*)
13. The limit of Participants: 200 (*Limit*)

15. The Conference is a fee-paying one (Fee), in accordance with the following rates and rules:

18. Types of conference papers: 20 minute lectures with an optional slideshow or a multimedia presentation, plenary lectures, reading group sessions (*Papers*)

19. Rules for submitting a Conference Paper proposal:

- b) types of proposal: a 250-word abstract (for individual papers), a 500-word abstract for a thematic panel
- c) abstract submission deadline: 23 February 2026
- d) the method of notification about the proposal acceptance: by mail

f) other information: further contact regarding the details of the Paper will be carried out by the Conference mail ijjfkrakow2026@uj.edu.pl. In deciding to accept or reject a Paper proposal, the Organiser will exercise discretion and consider the necessity of ensuring a high academic quality of the Conference. The Organiser's decision is final and does not require justification, and Participants have no right to appeal.

III. Photo Report and Recording (Rules for Sharing)

20. Rules for Sharing the Photo Report and Recording

- a) The Photo Report shall be made available
 - i) by 31.12.2026
 - ii) to an unlimited number of users
 - iii) on the Organiser's website and social media profiles: Facebook, Instagram.
- b) The Recording shall be made available
 - i) by 31.12.2026
 - ii) to an unlimited number of users
 - iii) on the Organiser's Youtube channel.

IV. Image Use (Rules for Using the Image)

21. The Image of the Participant, including the Participant who is a Plenary Speaker, captured in the Photo Report and in the Recording in connection with participation in the Conference (hereafter referred to as "Image"), will be made available in accordance with the following rules:

- a) The Image will be made available: on the Organiser's website and the Organiser's social media profiles: Facebook, Instagram, and YouTube, as well as in Conference promotional materials prepared by the Organiser
- b) The Image will be published without each time indicating the Participant as the person shown in the Photo Report and/or Recording, and in particular without indicating their name and surname, with the exception of Plenary Speakers, whose Image will be provided with the name and surname, title or academic degree and information about their professional activity.
- c) The Image will be published by 31 December 2026 for unlimited time.
- d) The Image will be made available to an unlimited number of users visiting the Organiser's website and its social media profiles, including Facebook, Instagram and Youtube.

e) The image will be used until consent is withdrawn. Consent may be withdrawn by contacting the Organiser at the following address: Institute of English Studies, Jagiellonian University, al. Mickiewicza 9a, 31-120 Kraków, Poland, or e-mail: k.bazarnik@uj.edu.pl.

The terms included in the Regulations and written with the initial capital letters have the meaning specified in the Conference Information Card.

Part 2: Rules of Participation in the Conference – Regulations

§ 1

Dates and Duration of the Conference

1. The present Regulations describe rights and obligations of the Participants of the Conference that shall be held in the on-site form on the Date and Place specified in the Card.
2. The Participant of the Conference is any adult person with full legal capacity, who within the Registration Dates, has expressed willingness to participate in the Conference or has accepted the Organiser's invitation to participate in the Conference, has registered for Conference participation in the manner described in § 2 of the Regulations, has accepted the Regulations, and has received from the Organiser a confirmation of acceptance to participate in the Conference (hereinafter referred to as the *Participant*).
3. The Regulations are made available to Participants on the Conference Website, in English, in a manner that allows it to be downloaded and opened without access to the internet.
4. The Organiser reserves the right to amend the Regulations due to changes in universally applicable laws and the need to adapt the Regulations to such changes, in particular to increase the safety measures applied at the Conference. Changes to the Regulations will come into force within 7 days of their publication on the Conference Website. For Participants who accepted the Regulations before the change, the change will take effect within 7 days from their notification of the change via email, provided they do not object to the change within the aforementioned period.
5. The Organiser reserves the right to amend the Regulations also in cases where such changes do not negatively affect the Participants' rights or involve correcting obvious clerical and editorial errors. In these cases, changes to the Regulations may come into force within a period shorter than 7 days, but not shorter than 3 days from notifying the

Participants of the change via email, provided they do not object to the change within the aforementioned period.

6. The Organiser reserves the right to change the Date and format of the Conference if holding it on the Date and form mentioned in section 1 above becomes impossible or excessively difficult due to reasons beyond the Organiser's control. Any change in the date or format of the Conference will be promptly announced on the Conference Website. Changes to the Conference programme do not constitute the changes of the Regulations.

7. The Conference programme is announced on the Conference Website. The Organiser reserves the right to make changes to the Conference programme, including the schedules times and order of Conference panels. If changes are made to the Conference programme, the Organiser shall promptly announce them on the Conference Website. Changes to Conference programme do not constitute changes of the Regulations.

§ 2

Registration for Conference participation

1. The participation in the Conference requires registration completing and submitting the Form available on the Registration Page.

2. Detailed instructions for registering for the Conference, including the Limit of Participants and Rules for qualifying for active participation in the Conference, are specified in the Card.

3. The Organiser is not liable for any incorrect or false data provided by the Participant during the registration for Conference participation.

4. The person who has registered for the Conference participation shall be notified via email by the Organiser about being accepted or not accepted to participate in the Conference.

5. By registering for Conference participation through the Form, the Participant confirms that they have read and accepted the Regulations, which is equivalent to granting the permissions, licenses, and authorisations mentioned in the Regulations, and constitutes an obligation to pay the Fee if the Conference is a fee-paying one. The Registration for Conference participation is completed when the Participant's data are filled in the Form and submitted through the Conference registration system on the Registration Website.

6. The Participant who has registered for the Conference secures participation in the Conference upon receiving confirmation of acceptance from the Organiser, and, in the case of a fee-paying Conference, on the condition that the Fee has been paid.

§ 3 General Rules of Conference Participation

1. Upon arrival at the Conference Venue, the Participant is required to confirm their personal attendance at the Conference at the reception desk.
2. To ensure safety at the Conference location, the Organiser may use surveillance covering the entire Conference area as well as its specific parts. The rules for using surveillance by the Organiser are defined in [Order No. 34 of the Rector of Jagiellonian University dated May 16, 2019](#), regarding the Video Surveillance Regulations at Jagiellonian University, as amended, available in the Public Information Bulletin of Jagiellonian University.
3. On-site Participants are required to comply with safety rules, health and safety regulations, and fire safety regulations in force at the venues where the Conference is organised, as well as with the sanitary regime rules in effect at that time.
4. In case of a Participant disrupting public order and safety, or non-compliance with the Regulations, Conference staff are authorized to:
 - a) call upon the Participant to behave appropriately;
 - b) request the Participant to leave the Conference premises;
 - c) call the appropriate services if the Participant's behaviour warrants such intervention, particularly if it poses a threat to other Participants, Conference personnel, or the Organiser's property.
5. The Organiser is not liable for incidents resulting from Participants' non-compliance with the Regulations, disregard for the Organiser's recommendations, or failure to follow the instructions of Conference personnel and security services.
6. Participants accept the established rules for the course of the Conference, the Conference programme, as well as the International James Joyce Foundation code of conduct available on the Conference Website (hereinafter referred to as the "*IJJF Code of Conduct*" included in Appendix 2), and commit not to introduce any changes to it or disrupt the Conference proceedings. The Organiser is entitled to exclude from the Conference Participants who violate the provisions of the Regulations, particularly those who:
 - a) disrupt the Conference proceedings;
 - b) engage in actions that are illegal, unethical, contrary to good practice, or harm the legitimate interests of third parties;
 - c) engage in actions aimed at circumventing or attempting to circumvent the Regulations and rules of the Conference;
 - d) engage in actions that violate the legitimate interests of the Organiser or harm the Organiser's image.

7. If a Participant notices a threat to the life and health of other Participants, they are obliged to immediately inform the Conference personnel.

8. When providing Conference materials (hereinafter referred to as *Conference Materials*) to Participants, the Organiser emphasizes the necessity for Participants to respect intellectual property rights. Participants undertake to use the Conference Materials provided by the Organiser exclusively for their personal use. Modifying, copying, transmitting, publicly performing or presenting, and any commercial use of the Conference Materials requires prior written consent from the Organiser or another authorized entity. Participants bear full responsibility for any damages resulting from behaviour contrary to the above stipulation.

§ 4 Conference Papers

1. A Participant registering for the Conference through the Form notifies the Organiser of their intention to deliver a Paper in accordance with the Rules for Paper Submission set out in the Card.

2. Acting in compliance with the Rules for Paper Submission, including in particular submitting an abstract of the Paper to the Organiser (hereafter referred to as *Abstract*), constitutes granting the Organiser a non-exclusive license unlimited in time, territory and quantity to use the Abstract, with the scope and in the fields of exploitation mentioned in § 4 sect. 5- 8 of the Regulations, with the right to grant sublicenses to third parties with a scope analogous to the scope of this license, for the purposes of selecting Speakers, preparing, Organising, conducting, and settling the Conference, developing Conference Materials, including a book of Abstracts, and for the purpose of promoting and informing about the Conference proceedings. If the Participant sends the Abstract to the Organiser for a purpose other than the selection of Papers, the provisions of this section shall apply accordingly.

3. The Participant accepted by the Organiser to deliver a Paper and the person who accepted the Organiser's invitation to present the Plenary (each of them hereinafter referred to as the *Speaker*) are fully responsible for the form and content of their Paper.

4. The Speaker undertakes to develop and present an original Paper and guarantees that the Paper will not infringe on the rights and personal interests of third parties, contain theses and views inciting hatred or discrimination against any person based on race, culture, ethnicity, religion, belief, or gender. Furthermore, it is prohibited to promote in a Paper ideologies and symbols associated with totalitarian regimes, as well as present any other topics prohibited by applicable law or that damage the good name of the Organiser.

5. If any part of the Paper includes legally protected elements for which the rights do not belong to the Speaker, the Speaker guarantees that they are entitled to use these elements to the extent necessary for the presentation of the Paper and to grant the

Organiser the sublicense referred to in this paragraph without the need for the Organiser to obtain additional consents and permissions.

6. The Speaker grants the Organiser a non-exclusive license unlimited in time, territory and quantity with the right to grant sublicenses with the same scope, to use the Paper in whole or in part, independently or as part of a collective work, in conjunction with works and elements selected by the Organiser (including Papers by other Speakers, images and sounds, included within so-called Conference Materials), as well as its edited version, adaptations, as well as all materials, graphics, passages, photo captures and documentation created in connection with the recording of the Paper – for informational, documentation, educational, didactic purposes, as well as for advertising and promotion of the Organiser and the Conference itself (hereafter referred to as *License*).

7. The license is granted to the Organiser at the moment of presenting the Paper and includes the use of the Paper in the following fields of exploitation:

- a) publishing in the internet, as well as through any telecommunications services using any systems and devices, on any of the Organiser's profiles on social networking sites, and on the Organiser's websites;
- b) recording and permanent or temporary reproducing of the Paper by using any available techniques and technologies;
- c) with regard to the distribution of the Paper – public performance, exhibition, display, playback, and broadcasting and re-broadcasting, as well as public access to the Paper in such a way that anyone can access it at a place and time of their choice using any available techniques, and broadcasting the Paper via multimedia and telecommunications networks;
- d) with regard to trading the original or copies on which the Paper is recorded – introducing to trade, lending, or renting the original or copies;
- e) creating and distributing derivative works of the Paper, including further projects/materials based on the Paper or its specific components, and using such derived works to the extent and in all fields of exploitation specified in this paragraph;
- f) re-broadcasting, distributing in the press, on the internet, on large-format posters, and in all other forms of promotion or advertising;
- g) modifying the Paper in whole or in part and preparing adaptations in whole or in part;
- h) the right to freely use the Paper and its individual for the purposes of advertising, promotion, or activities conducted by the University in Poland and abroad.

8. The License also includes the right for the Organiser and persons acting on its behalf to exercise derivative rights to the Paper in all fields of exploitation mentioned in this paragraph.

9. The Speaker undertakes not to exercise against the Organiser and entities authorized by the Organiser their moral rights to the paper, including the right to the integrity of the content and form of the Paper and its fair use, provided that the use complies with the License, the right to decide on the first public release of the Paper, the right to supervise the manner in which the Paper is used, and the right to decide on the manner of attributing the authorship of the Paper, with the provision that the Organiser, at the Speaker's request and as far as possible, shall respect the Speaker's wish to be credited as the presenter of the Paper.

10. In the event that third parties submit claims against the Organiser and/or entities acting on its behalf and/or entities authorized by the Organiser to use the Paper (collectively referred to as the *Authorized Entities*) related to the Paper and/or its Abstract, or their specific elements, the Speaker:

a) will release the Organiser and/or the Authorized Entities from such claims, to the extent that the Speaker was obliged to acquire from third parties the rights to legally protected elements of the Paper and/or its Abstract, including copyright and rights derivative to them and their specific elements, and to obtain the consents and authorizations referred to in this paragraph, and

b) will bear full liability for any damages incurred by the Organiser and/or the Authorized Entities due to claims mentioned above, including but not limited to damages related to a claim for compensation for unauthorized use of the Paper and/or Abstract, or unauthorized use of their specific elements.

§ 5

Recording and Photo Report

1. The Organiser plans to prepare a photo report (hereinafter referred to as *Photo Report*) and audio-video recordings (hereinafter referred to as *Recording*) of the Conference, to which the Participant grants their consent.
2. The Speaker agrees to the recording of the Paper by the Organiser, or an entity acting on its behalf, in the form of a Photo Report. The plenary Speaker agrees to the recording of the Plenary Lecture by the Organiser, or an entity acting on its behalf, in the form of a Recording and a Photo Report.
3. The Organiser shall make the Recording and Photo Report available in accordance with Rules for Sharing.
4. The Recording and Photo Report will be used for educational, teaching, informational, documentary, and promotional purposes of the Organiser and of the Conference, as well as for archiving.

5. The licence referred to in § 4 of the Regulations is also granted with regard to the Recording containing the Plenary Lecture or its elements.

§ 6 Image

1. By registering to participate in the Conference, the Participant, including the Participant who is a Speaker, grants their consent, unlimited in time, territory and quantity, to the use of their Image in accordance with the Rules for Using the Image.
2. The consent referred to in sect. 1 above covers the use of the Participant's Image captured in the Photo Report and/or Recording.
3. The Image may not be used for purposes of ridicule or satire, or in any way that could damage the Participant's good name or reputation.
4. The use of the Image includes recording, processing, reproduction and multiple release of the Image recorded in connection with participation in the Conference and in accordance with the Rules for Using the Image.
5. The Image will be used exclusively in connection with the Conference – for educational, teaching, informational, documentary, advertising and promotional purposes of the Organiser and the Conference itself, and for archiving, including in particular a Photo Report on the Organiser's websites, on the Organiser's social media profiles, at the Organiser's promotional events and in the Organiser's promotional materials specified in the Card in the Rules for Using the Image.
6. With regard to the use of the Image, the Participant shall not exercise the right to control and approve each use of the Image, including the right to approve the final form of the Photo Report and/or Recording in which the Image was used, and the right to identify them as the person featured in the Photo Report and/or Recording.
7. The Conference may be recorded only by the Organiser. Participants are prohibited from recording or taking photographs during the Conference without the prior consent of the Organiser.

§ 7 Final Provisions

1. These Regulations are made available to Conference Participants on the Conference Website and in the Form, and it comes into effect on the day it is posted on the Conference Website.
2. Presenting the Paper, as well as granting the Organiser the License, consents, authorizations and licenses specified in the Regulations (for using the Abstract, Paper and Image of the Participants, including Speakers) in the scope and fields of use stipulated in the Regulations, is free of charge and is done for the statutory purposes of the Organiser, unless it is subject to separate agreements concluded with the Speaker.
3. Granting the Organiser the License, consents, authorizations, and licenses specified in the Regulations is voluntary but necessary for presenting the Paper/Plenary Lecture.

4. If the Conference is cancelled, the Organiser shall promptly inform about it on the Conference Website. The Organiser will not be liable to any compensation or damages to Participants and Speakers due to the cancellation, nor to reimburse any costs incurred for participating in the Conference, except for the refund of the Fee.
5. Subject to mandatory provisions, the law applicable to the contract for participation in the Conference concluded by accepting the Regulations, is Polish law. For matters not stipulated by the Regulations, the generally applicable provisions of Polish law shall apply, in particular the Civil Code and the Law of 4 February 1994 on copyright and derivative rights.
6. Subject to mandatory provisions, all disputes shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the of Polish common courts.
7. The Conference Card is an integral part of the Regulations.
8. The Information on Processing of Personal Data of the Conference Participants consists Appendix 1 to the present Regulations.

Appendix 1

Processing of Personal Data

In accordance with Article 13 of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation, hereinafter "GDPR"), Jagiellonian University informs that:

1. The administrator of the Participant's personal data is Jagiellonian University, ul. Gołębia 24, 31-007 Kraków, represented by the Rector of Jagiellonian University.
2. Jagiellonian University has appointed a Data Protection Officer, ul. Czapskich 4, 31-110 Kraków. Contact with the Data Protection Officer is possible via email: iod@uj.edu.pl or by phone at 12 663 12 25 – from Monday to Friday, from 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM.
3. The Participant's personal data will be processed for the purpose of:
 - a) fulfilling the contract, which involves participating in the XXX International James Joyce Symposium (hereinafter referred to as *Conference*), as well as for the purpose of registering for the Conference, accepting Participants willing to deliver a Paper or a Plenary Lecture, based on Article 6(1)(b) GDPR, based on the contract concluded by accepting the Regulations. The Conference, Organised by Jagiellonian University, will be held on site from June 15 to June 19, 2026;
 - b) preparing and publishing of the Recording and Photo Report of the Conference for documentary, informational, educational, didactic and promotional purposes of the Organiser and of the Conference itself, and archiving with regard to the Participant's personal data in the form of the Image on the basis of the consent granted in accordance with the Act on Copyright and Related Rights pursuant to Article 6 paragraph 1 letter e) of the GDPR, i.e. in the public interest, which is the organisation of conferences and other events by universities in connection with Article 11 of the Act on Higher Education and Science.
 - c) ensuring the safety of the Conference in accordance with the applicable UJ Video Surveillance Regulations available on the website <https://bip.uj.edu.pl/> and the information obligation regarding the processing of images in video surveillance available on the website <https://iod.uj.edu.pl/monitoring-wizyjny> based on Article 6(1)(e) GDPR – in relation to data from video surveillance.
4. Providing personal data by the Participant:
 - a) with respect to the data referred to in point 3(a) above is necessary for concluding the contract and participating in the Conference, preparing and delivering the Paper and Plenary Lecture;

b) with respect to the data referred to in point 3(b) above is voluntary, but failure to provide it – due to the obligation to ensure the safety of Participants – results in the inability to participate in the Conference.

5. The Participant's personal data may be disclosed to entities authorized to receive them under generally applicable law.

6. Recipients of the Participant's personal data are entities providing IT and Organisational support in Organising the Conference – including the entity supplying software for participant registration.

7. The Participant's personal data will not be transferred to third countries (outside the European Economic Area) or to international Organisations.

8. The data will be stored for the duration of the Conference Organisation and until the final settlement and closure of the Conference, as well as until the expiration of claims that may arise from the fulfilment of the contract referred to in paragraph 3(a). Data from video surveillance will be processed for a maximum of 3 months. Personal data specified in point 3(b) above will be processed until an objection is filed.

9. Personal data provided in the Registration and Submission Forms will not be shared with third parties.

10. In the case of a Participant who has expressed a desire to deliver a Paper or has accepted an invitation to deliver a Plenary Lecture, personal data voluntarily indicated in the content of the Abstract will be processed on the Conference Website for informational and documentation purposes.

11. The Participant has the right to: obtain information about the processing of personal data and the rights conferred under the GDPR, access the content of their data and correct them, as well as the right to delete personal data from the administrator's records (unless further processing is necessary to fulfil a legal obligation or to establish, assert, or defend claims), and the right to limit processing, data portability, object to processing – in cases and under conditions specified in the GDPR.

12. The Participant's personal data will not be subject to automated decision-making or profiling.

13. The Participant has the right to file a complaint with the President of the Personal Data Protection Office if they believe that the processing of their personal data violates the provisions of the GDPR.

Appendix 2

International James Joyce Foundation (IJJF) Symposium Code of Conduct (Kraków 2026)

The International James Joyce Foundation (IJJF) symposia are convened for scholarly exchange, learning, and community engagement in the spirit of free inquiry and free expression. The IJJF is committed to fostering a respectful, inclusive, safe, and intellectually engaging environment for all participants—scholars, students, writers, and Joyce enthusiasts alike. All participants are expected to help create a collegial atmosphere in which vigorous debate can take place.

1. Respect and inclusion

Participants must treat others with respect and use inclusive language. Discrimination, bullying, or harassment are not acceptable in any form, whether in person or online, during academic sessions, social events, or Symposium-related communications.

Harassment includes (but is not limited to) unwanted sexual attention, stalking, sustained disruption, deliberate intimidation, and derogatory, demeaning, or hostile verbal or written remarks. Discrimination or harassment includes conduct targeting a person on the basis of race, ethnicity, nationality, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, disability, age or religion.

2. Constructive conduct

Participants are expected to engage in discussion constructively and to focus criticism on ideas rather than individuals. Personal attacks, intimidation, and repeated disruption of sessions, Q&A, or event activities are not acceptable.

4. Consent and privacy

Recording presentations, photographing slides, or photographing posters is permitted only where the Symposium indicates it is allowed. Where recording or photography is restricted, this will be signposted or stated by the chair/presenter. If a participant or presenter requests not to be recorded or photographed, that request must be respected.

Participants must respect personal boundaries and privacy. Photography, recording, or sharing identifiable information about others requires consent where it is reasonably expected (e.g., private conversations, informal gatherings, or where someone requests not to be recorded). The Organisers may appoint official or accredited photographers; where official recording occurs, this will be indicated.

5. Compliance with Organisers' directions

Participants must follow reasonable directions from Symposium staff/volunteers regarding safety, conduct, and event operations.

6. Consequences

Breaches of this Code may result in action appropriate to the circumstances, up to and including confirming boundaries between participants, removal from the Symposium without refund, and/or further action by the Foundation.
